## Accessing Nutritious Foods

With the summer harvest season upon us, ensuring the safety and efficiency of your pressure canner is paramount. The Calloway County Cooperative Extension Office is offering free pressure canner testing and hosting a series of canning classes to help you preserve your produce safely and effectively.

Proper maintenance of your pressure canner is crucial for safe food preservation. A faulty pressure canner can lead to under processed food, which poses a risk of foodborne illness. To assist the community, we are providing free pressure canner testing. Bring your pressure canner lid with the gauge to the office, we will check its accuracy and overall condition.

The Extension Office is also offering hands-on canning classes this June, perfect for both beginners and experienced canners looking to brush up on their skills. These classes will cover the fundamentals of home canning, including best practices, safety tips, and delicious recipes to try at home.

To register for these classes or for more information on pressure canner testing, please contact the Calloway County Cooperative Extension Office at (270) 753-1452. Embrace the art of home canning this summer and ensure your pantry is stocked with safe, delicious, homemade preserves. The cost will be \$5 for each class. You will not leave this class empty handed!




